

Important Notice from MultiCare Health System About Your Prescription Drug Coverage and Medicare

THIS NOTICE MIGHT NOT APPLY TO YOU IF YOU OR YOUR COVERED DEPENDENTS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR MEDICARE (OR WILL NOT BECOME ELIGIBLE FOR MEDICARE IN THE NEXT 12 MONTHS). HOWEVER, EMPLOYERS WHO OFFER MEDICAL COVERAGE THAT INCLUDE PRESCRIPTION DRUG BENEFITS ARE REQUIRED BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO SEND THIS NOTICE ANNUALLY.

Please read this notice carefully and keep it where you can find it. This notice has information about current prescription drug coverage with the *MultiCare Health System Medical Plan* and about your options under Medicare's prescription drug coverage. This information can help you decide whether or not you want to join a Medicare drug plan. If you are considering joining, you should compare your current coverage, including which drugs are covered at what cost, with the coverage and costs of the plans offering Medicare prescription drug coverage in your area. Information about where you can get help to make decisions about your prescription drug coverage is at the end of this notice. There are two important things you need to know about your current group medical plan coverage and Medicare's prescription drug coverage:

1. Medicare prescription drug coverage became available in 2006 to everyone with Medicare. You can get this coverage if you join a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan or join a Medicare Advantage Plan (like an HMO or PPO) that offers prescription drug coverage. All Medicare drug plans provide at least a standard level of coverage set by Medicare. Some plans may also offer more coverage for a higher monthly premium.
2. MultiCare Health System has determined that the prescription drug coverage offered by the Medical Plans in 2025 is, on average for all plan participants, expected to pay out as much as standard Medicare prescription drug coverage pays and is therefore considered Creditable Coverage. Because your existing coverage is Creditable Coverage, you can keep this coverage and not pay a higher premium (a penalty) if you later decide to join a Medicare drug plan.

When Can You Join A Medicare Drug Plan?

You can join a Medicare drug plan when you first become eligible for Medicare and each year from October 15th through December 7th. However, if you lose your current creditable prescription drug coverage, through no fault of your own, you will also be eligible for a two (2) month Special Enrollment Period (SEP) to join a Medicare drug plan.

What Happens To Your Current Coverage If You Decide to Join A Medicare Drug Plan?

If you decide to join a Medicare drug plan, your current MultiCare Health System coverage will not be affected. You can retain the existing MultiCare Health System coverage and choose not to enroll in a Part D drug plan, or you can enroll in a Part D plan as a supplement to, or in lieu of other coverage. The current MultiCare Health System coverage pays for other health expenses in addition to prescription drugs. If you enroll in a Medicare prescription drug plan, you and your eligible dependents will still be able to receive all of your current health and prescription drug benefits. If you do decide to join a Medicare drug plan and drop your current MultiCare Health System coverage, be aware that you and your dependents will be able to get this coverage back by re-enrolling into the MultiCare Health System benefit plan during the annual open enrollment period for employees and eligible beneficiaries under the MultiCare Health System benefit plan.

When Will You Pay A Higher Premium (Penalty) To Join A Medicare Drug Plan?

You should also know that if you drop or lose your current coverage with MultiCare Health System and don't join a Medicare drug plan within 63 continuous days after your current coverage ends, you may pay a higher premium (a penalty) to join a Medicare drug plan later.

If you go 63 continuous days or longer without creditable prescription drug coverage, your monthly premium may go up by at least 1% of the Medicare base beneficiary premium per month for every month that you did not have that coverage. For example, if you go nineteen months without creditable coverage, your premium may consistently be at least 19% higher than the Medicare base beneficiary premium. You may have to pay this higher premium (a penalty) as long as you have Medicare prescription drug coverage. In addition, you may have to wait until the following November to join.

If you decide to join one of the Medicare drug plans, you may be required to provide a copy of this notice when you join to show whether or not you have maintained creditable coverage and, therefore, whether or not you are required to pay a higher premium (a penalty).
